



BULLDOG PRIDE NIGHT 2020 HEALTH & SAFETY PLAN

Bulldog Pride Night is an annual tailgate party held prior to the first home RHS Football Game of the season and coordinated by the Rolla Area Chamber of Commerce.

This event serves to promote Bulldog Team Spirit as we kick off the sports season, but it also serves as a scholarship fundraiser for the RACC's Show Me Scholars Program.

Guests are encouraged to wear a mask.

As of the date of this publication, and subject to change, the Center for Disease Control (CDC) advise that people with COVID-19 may have symptoms ranging from mild to severe illness. Symptoms typically appear **2-14** days after exposure to the virus. If you have or notice any of the following symptoms, please **STAY HOME!**

- Fever
- Cough
- Shortness of Breath
- Fatigue
- Nausea
- Persistent Chest Pain
- Inability to Stay Awake
- Chills
- Shaking with Chills
- Muscle / Body Aches
- Congestion
- Diarrhea
- New Confusion
- Blush Lips or Face
- Headache
- Sore Throat
- Loss of taste or smell
- Runny Nose
- Trouble Breathing
- Inability to Wake
- Vomiting

The CDC has provided the following control and preventative guidance to all, regardless of exposure risk:

- Frequently wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. When soap and running water are unavailable, use an alcohol-based hand rub with at least 60% alcohol.
- If you need to sneeze or cough, please do so into a tissue or your elbow
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, or mouth with unwashed hands.
- Follow appropriate respiratory etiquette, which includes covering your mouth and nose or using the inside of your elbow for coughs and sneezes.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.

Venue:

We will be using the RHS lower parking lot for Bulldog Pride Night 2020 on August 28. The event will be held from 5:30-7:00. Vendor set up will be held from 4:30-5:30.

All guests will enter the venue on the fenced side of the parking lot. Guests will need to keep 6-foot distancing from other guests while in line. All guests will use the hand sanitizer before entering the venue. All guests will exit from the cafeteria side of the venue.

Directional arrows will be marked on the parking lot showing guests which way to go to get to the vendors. No jumping lines will be allowed.

The number of people allowed inside the venue will be limited to 500 at one time. Volunteers will be tasked with counting the number of people going in and coming out.

6' distancing marking will be labeled throughout the venue to keep people separated while in line for vendors.

Sanitizer will be available throughout the event, specifically at the entrance, exit, and vendor booths.

Vendors:

If you or any of your staff have been around anyone with possible symptoms, please stay home. If you feel sick or have a temperature over 100 degrees, stay home.

Vendors will be limited to half the amount normally allowed totaling 55 vendors.

Vendors will be allowed to hand out Bulldog Merchandise as well as food if the food is pre-packaged and not prepared on site. If condiments are required for the food item, it will need to be included in the packaging for the guests. (Example: wrapped hot dog, ketchup, mustard, napkin all included in a bag and handed to the guest.)

All vendors will be required to wear masks during the event.

All vendors will be required to have hand sanitizer at their booth for use by the public.

No loitering will be allowed at the vendor booths.

Each vendor table will be pre-assigned. One space will be between each vendor allowing for proper distancing of both vendors and guests waiting in line.

Vendors who will have a game for the guests to play must require participants to use hand sanitizer before and after each game if using shared equipment. Shared equipment should also be sanitized throughout the evening.

Volunteers:

All volunteers must be familiar with this plan and be available to answer questions any other volunteer or guest may have.

Volunteers will be required to wear masks during the event.

It is the volunteer's ultimate responsibility to keep everyone safe during this event. We must be diligent in making sure our guests are maintaining a 6' social distancing between individuals or groups.

It is our responsibility to make sure guests and vendors know that we will shut down if crowd control becomes a problem or if people refuse to follow direction.

Volunteers and vendors will have to answer the following questions upon arrival. Anyone answering yes, will be denied entry to the event, and asked to go home.

- **In the last 14 days have you had a fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath, sore throat, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, diarrhea, and/or fatigue?**
- **In the last 14 days, have you had close contact (been within 6 feet) with a suspected or laboratory confirmed COVID-19 patient?**
- **In the last 14 days, have you travelled to areas where community transmission of COVID-19 is widespread?**

Make sure signs are visible around festival lots regarding masks, social distancing, and hygiene.

Check sanitizer stations throughout the venue to confirm they are readily available.

Volunteers shall report to a Chamber staff member if they notice any vendor or guest not following proper guidelines.

The Chamber staff has the right to ask a vendor to close in the event they have been warned and refuse to follow guidelines.

The Chamber staff has the right to ask a guest to leave in the event they have been warned and refuse to follow guidelines.

Guests:

If you have been around anyone with possible symptoms, please stay home. If you feel sick or have a temperature over 100 degrees, stay home.

Remember you are attending an outdoor event. Masks are recommended but are not required. If you are comfortable wearing a mask, please do.

You are required to maintain social distancing of 6 feet.

Limit your group attending to 10 or fewer guests. Make sure you keep 6' from other guests/groups.

Have patience and be prepared to briefly wait in line.

Watch for ground markings at vendor booths.

Avoid physical contact with other guests.

Hand sanitizer is available throughout the event and at every vendor station. Please use this as you feel necessary. It should be used before and after each game or other children's activity.

Avoid touching items at the vendors tables. Please wait for them to hand the items to you.

Any guest showing symptoms of COVID-19 will be asked to leave the premises immediately. Guests asked to leave for this reason will be asked to provide a name and phone number.
